

# Artistic Practice featuring visual and performance artist Linda Lamignan: "those who do not travel never arrive"

Using myriad expressive forms and artistic practices, Linda Lamignan explores concepts of wandering and the diaspora, transformation, and love, in works that tell stories of floating between worlds.

Sculptures made of paraffin wax encircled by brightly coloured fabrics, complex musical compositions, video works inspired by the humour of B movies, and a precise ongoing performative practice. A list that represents just a fraction of Norwegian-Nigerian Linda Lamignan's oeuvre, indicative of the artist's versatility and range.

# Nature and Raw Materials in Colonial History

For Linda Lamignan, the African calabash plays a central role in processing the personal emotions and resistance strategies involved in existing between different cultures and normative categories:

"In my work, the calabash is a container for the energies, stories and memories we bring with us on our journeys. By transforming a material like petroleum wax, which has a very dark and violent history, into the shape of the calabash, I try to soften and heal this industry and create a vessel for alternative futures. I want to create visions of a different direction for the brutal actions and history of the oil industry", says Linda Lamignan on works exploring the artist's personal relationship to colonial history, and the role nature and raw materials play in that history.

In their ongoing attempt to heal of the violence done to the earth and people by the oil industry, Lamignan works with materials that have direct links to the ties between the oil industries in West Africa and Scandinavia. This oil also flows in Lamignan's veins, permeating relationships between the cultures of the two regions, and impacting on members of the artist's family in both.

Lamignan's animistic approach to creation explores the links between economic value and cultural value. Their artistic practice and the oils that flow through our bodies give the viewer the opportunity to join the journey and become part of nature's living landscapes.

Lamignan's diverse range of expressive forms can also be seen in the video filmed in October 2022 at Kunsthal Charlottenborg, where the artist met with Cédric Fauq, chief curator at CAPC musée d'art contemporain de Bordeaux:

"To encounter Linda's work is to enter a realm where poetry and politics collide to help us perceive – not only with the eye – the entanglement of colonialism, contemporary economics, ancestralism and other-than-human beings. Through the manipulation of liquid materials, collage strategies applied to video-making, and community-gathering, the diversity of their practice, defying notions of genres and tones, makes them one of the most exciting artists to follow today," says Cédric Fauq.

# **About Linda Lamingan**

Visual and performance artist Linda Lamignan's works communicate feelings of being alien and floating between different worlds. Through video, music, objects and performance, Lamignan explores narratives relating to wandering and the diaspora, transformation and love. With an animist approach Lamignan works in materials connected to the industries, histories, living landscapes and cultural relationships between West Africa and Scandinavia.

Linda Lamignan graduated with an MFA from the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts in 2019, and holds a BFA from Oslo National Academy of the Arts.

2022 was a busy year for Lamignan, with exhibitions in Denmark, Norway and Germany, including the solo exhibition those who do not travel never arrive: Carry your home at Rogaland Art, and a collaborative performance concert with her new band Mosi oa Tunya at Roskilde Festival.

In 2002 Lamignan also completed a four-month residency at Cité Internationale des Arts in Paris, contributed to the exhibition *Dangerous When Wet* at Copenhagen Contemporary, and was awarded the Danish Art Foundation's three-year working grant, one of Denmark's most meaningful acknowledgements of artistic talent.


Cédric Fauq also writes and develops freelance projects.
